Absentee Voting Instructions

- a. Use a #2 pencil for marking your ballot card.
- b. Study the candidates' names which appear on the ballot.
- c. Note that next to the choice is a number.
- d. Using the #2 pencil, completely darken and fill in the rectangle on the ballot card containing the number for each candidate of your choice.
- e. If you wish to write in the name of a qualified write-in candidate, where permitted, note the number associated with that office. Completely darken and fill in the rectangle on the ballot card containing the number for that office and write-in. Turn the card over and write the name of your write-in, the office, and the number from the front side. Please note write-in votes are authorized only in certain races.
- f. **If you tear, or deface or wrongly mark this ballot card, return it and get another.**

**PRESIDENTIAL INSTRUCTIONS**

- a. To vote for the presidential election, completely darken and fill in the rectangle on the ballot card containing the number for the political party for whose candidate you wish to vote.
- b. A vote for the names of a political party's candidates for President and Vice-President is a vote for the Electors of that party, the names of whom are on file with the Secretary of State.

**INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTER**

- a. To vote for all candidates of one party (a straight ticket), completely darken and fill in the rectangle on the ballot card containing the number of the party for whose candidates you wish to vote.
- b. You may vote a split ticket by not marking the rectangle on the ballot card containing the number of the party location, but by marking the rectangle on the ballot card containing the number of the name of each candidate for whom you wish to vote.
- c. You may also vote a split ticket by marking the rectangle on the ballot card containing the number of the party location and then marking the rectangle on the ballot card containing the number of the name of any candidate you choose of a different party. In any multi-seat race where a party is marked and you vote for a candidate of another party, **you must also** mark the rectangle on the ballot card containing the number of any candidate you choose of the party for which you marked the rectangle to assure your vote will count.

**CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS**

**INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTER**

a. To vote FOR the amendment, completely darken and fill in the rectangle on the ballot card containing the number of the word FOR.

b. To vote AGAINST the amendment, completely darken and fill in the rectangle on the ballot card containing the number of the word AGAINST.

**CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT I**

Constitutional amendment to promote local economic and community development projects by (i) permitting the General Assembly to enact general laws giving counties, cities, and towns the power to finance public improvements associated with qualified private economic and community improvements within development districts, as long as the financing is secured by the additional tax revenues resulting from the enhanced property value within the development district and is not secured by a pledge of the local government's faith and credit or general taxing authority, which financing is not subject to a referendum; and (ii) permitting the owners of the property in the development district to agree to a minimum tax value for their property, which is binding on future owners as long as the development district is in existence.

Constitutional amendment to provide that the General Assembly may place the clear proceeds of civil penalties, civil forfeitures, and civil fines collected by a State agency in a State fund to be used exclusively for maintaining free public schools.
