VOTING INSTRUCTIONS

- a. Examine the ballot carefully.
- b. Once you have made your selections, press the GRAY button next to the candidate of your choice. An X will appear next to that candidate's name.
- c. If you would like to change your selection, press the GRAY button and make a different selection.
- d. If you wish to write in the name of a qualified write-in candidate, where permitted, press the GRAY button beside "Write-In". The write-in screen will appear. Press the buttons beside the letters to spell the candidate's name. The name will appear in the center of the screen. Press the Done button to accept. You will be returned to the regular ballot.
- e. Once you have completed your selections, press the RED CAST VOTE button to cast your vote.

PRESIDENTIAL INSTRUCTIONS

- a. To vote for the presidential election, Press the GRAY button next to the political party for whose candidate you wish to vote.
- b. A vote for the names of a political party's candidates for President and Vice-President is a vote for the Electors of that party, the names of whom are on file with the Secretary of State.

**CONSTITUTIONAL
AMENDMENT I**

Constitutional amendment to promote local economic and community development projects by (i) permitting the General Assembly to enact general laws giving counties, cities, and towns the power to finance public improvements associated with qualified private economic and community improvements within development districts, as long as the financing is secured by the additional tax revenues resulting from the enhanced property value within the development district and is not secured by a pledge of the local government's faith and credit or general taxing authority, which financing is not subject to a referendum; and (ii) permitting the owners of the property in the development district to agree to a minimum tax value for their property, which is binding on future owners as long as the development district is in existence.

AMENDMENT II**

Constitutional amendment to provide that the General Assembly may place the clear proceeds of civil penalties, civil forfeitures, and civil fines collected by a State agency in a State fund to be used exclusively for maintaining free public schools.

Constitutional amendment to provide for the first term of office for magistrates of the General Court of Justice to be two years and for subsequent terms to be four years.
