Background: According to Article III, Section 302 D. 7, of the Road Naming Ordinance, roads with continuous alignments should have only one name.

Uniform number ranges and street segments are a valuable and necessary part of the E-911 System and critical for emergency responders. Bond Road, Holly Shelter Harbor Drive, and Shelter Creek Drive are in continuous alignment and should be named as such.

The residents along this roadway have requested to change the name to Moonlight Cove.

Under the authority and provision of the General Statutes of North Carolina, Chapter 153A-239.1, a county may, by ordinance, name or rename any road within the county and may assign or reassign street numbers for use on such road. The statute requires that a public hearing be held on the matter.

Specific Action Requested: The Board is requested to hold a public hearing to determine if the County should rename and readdress Bond Road, Holly Shelter Harbor Drive and Shelter Creek Drive to Moonlight Cove.



For well over one hundred years the Bond family has owned property from N.C. Highway #53 back to Shelter Creek. James Henry Bond, father of Norman Bond owned property over in an area where the proposed Holly Shelter Harbor Cove (this name suggested at a public meeting February 17, 1992). There were ten children in the family of James Bond; three daughters, Wilma, Norma and Annie; and seven sons: Evander (farmer and manager of S.S. Kress, Wilmington, N. C.), Acrel (farmer and known as the "Bee Man"), W. J. (farmer), Clinton, (farmer and owner of Pen-Du Rest Home), Norman (owned Bond Electric Company, city electrical inspector, Wilmington, N. C.), and Clifton (died at age nine due to an accident on the school bus).


James and his wife Lennie Bond became disabled in their late years and the children all agreed to sign over the property of their mother and father to Acrel Bond (one of the sons), as he was taking care of their mother and father.

As time went on Bryant and Alma Chadwick (who owned the land which Norman Bond purchased in 1970) died and the State of North Carolina took control of their property as payment for taxes and medical care.

In June 1970 Norman Bond acquired the family's old home place by being the high bidder, as the property which the State held was offered for sale at public auction at the court house in Burgaw, North Carolina. This was a purchase of sixty-two (62) acres.

On and before June 1970, entrance to the properties mentioned above was from the Old Bay Road (a public road) off Highway #53 through Jerry Ward property. Mr. Ward owned farm land on both sides of the Old Bay Road. At the

time of Mr. Bond's purchase of the sixty-two (62) acres, Jerry Ward came to Mr. Bond and told him that if he would build a road in the swamp, just west of the Old Bay Road, in order to close the public road through his fields, then he would give him all the property needed for this new road.
