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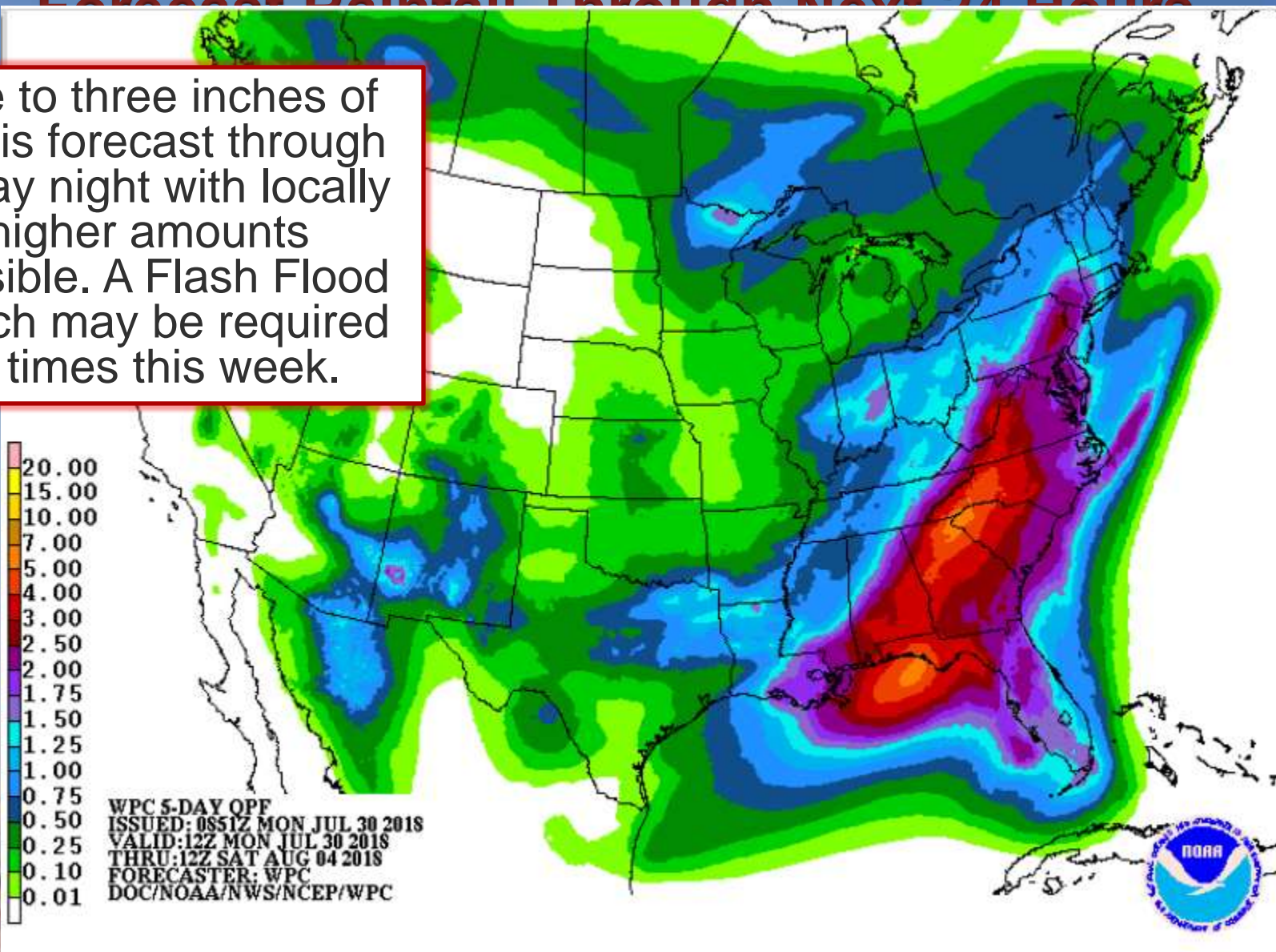


Highlights

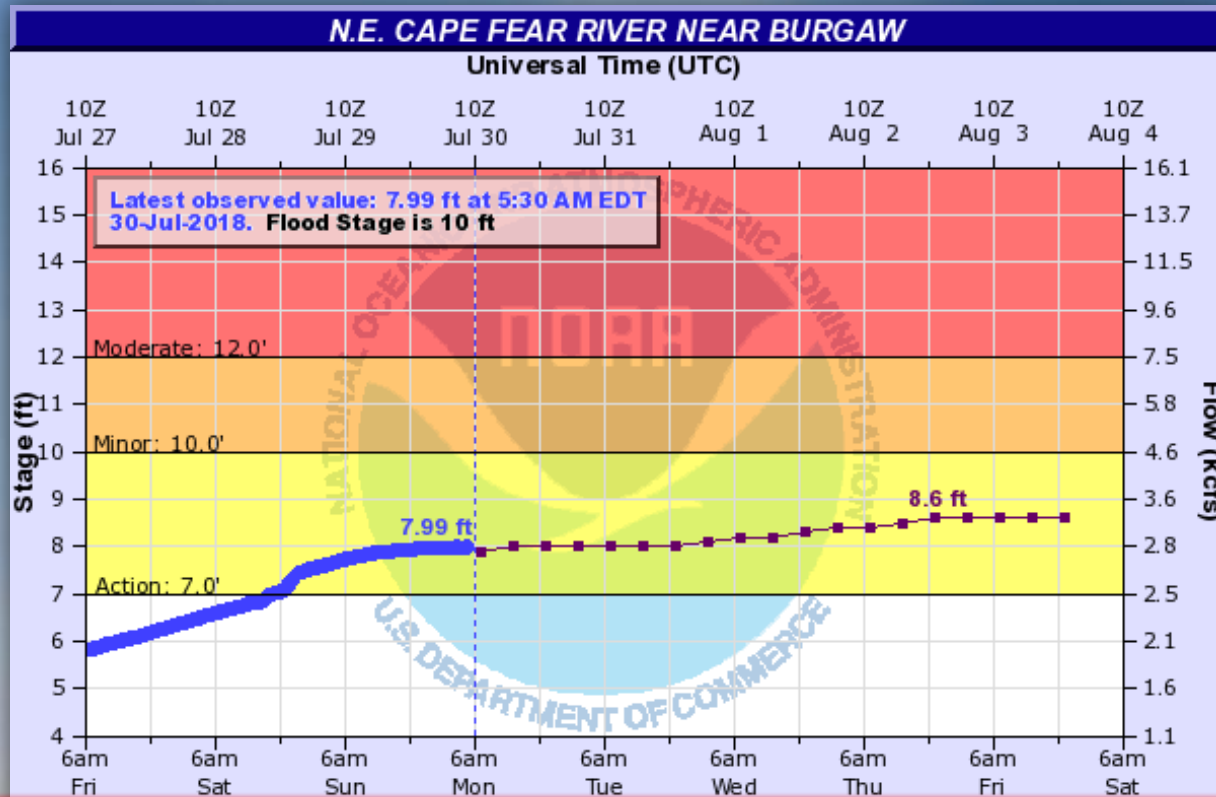
- There is a moderate risk of rip currents at all the beaches in southeast North Carolina and northeast South Carolina today.
- A flood advisory is in effect for the Northeast Cape Fear River near Burgaw.
- Deep tropical moisture will remain in place over the area this week due to deep southerly flow between an upper level low pressure to the west and Bermuda high pressure to the east.
- Impulses moving through the area aloft and surface features like the sea breeze, land breeze, and storm outflows will act on this moisture to provide a focus for shower and thunderstorm development every day this week.
- Temperatures are expected to be seasonal.

Forecast Rainfall Through Next 24 Hours

One to three inches of rain is forecast through Friday night with locally higher amounts possible. A Flash Flood Watch may be required at times this week.



Northeast Cape Fear River



A flood advisory is in effect for the Northeast Cape Fear River near Burgaw for river levels expected to reach 8 to 9 feet. It is possible that additional rainfall this week could cause the river to exceed flood stage later this week into the weekend.



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
