Outlook Weekend Period: November 17-18, 2018

TRANQUIL WEATHER EXPECTED THIS WEEKEND

OVERVIEW: Center of surface high pressure will become parked across the bi-state region of NC and SC during this weekend. This will produce mostly sunny skies and mostly clear nights each day. Daily highs will be near normal, in the 60s, and overnight lows will be at or slightly below normal, with mid to upper 30s, except 40 to 45 along the immediate coast. Patchy Frost is possible both Sat and Sun mornings, possibly more widespread inland Sat.

WWA: (Watch Warning Advisory)

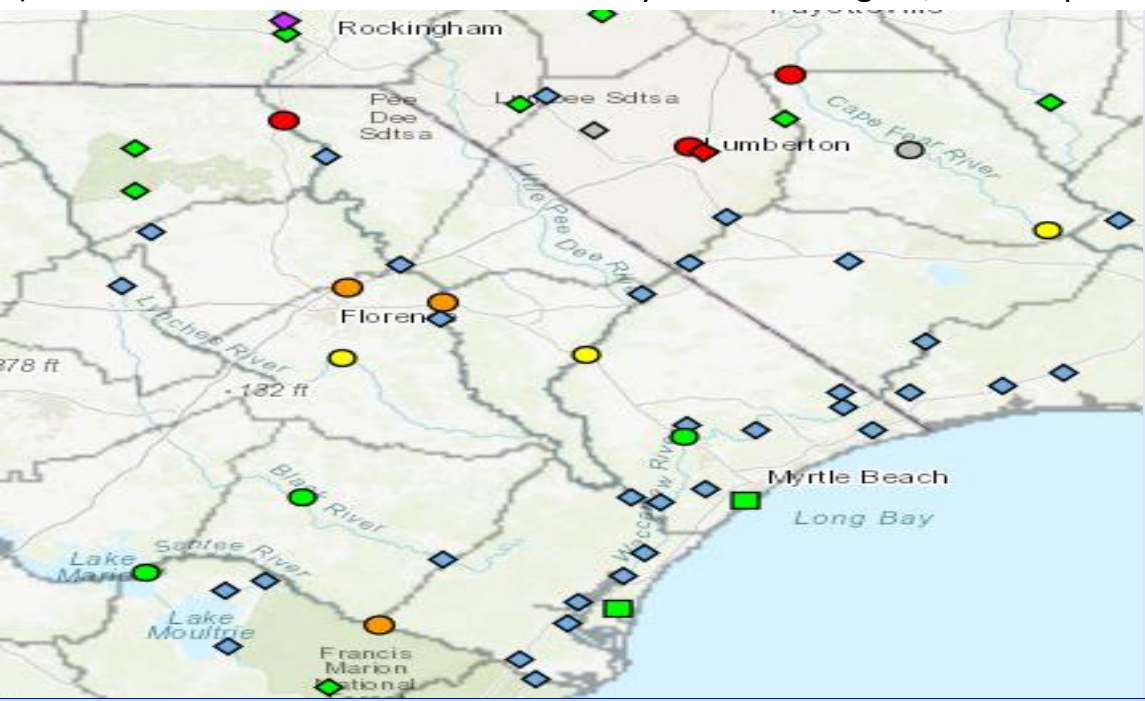
