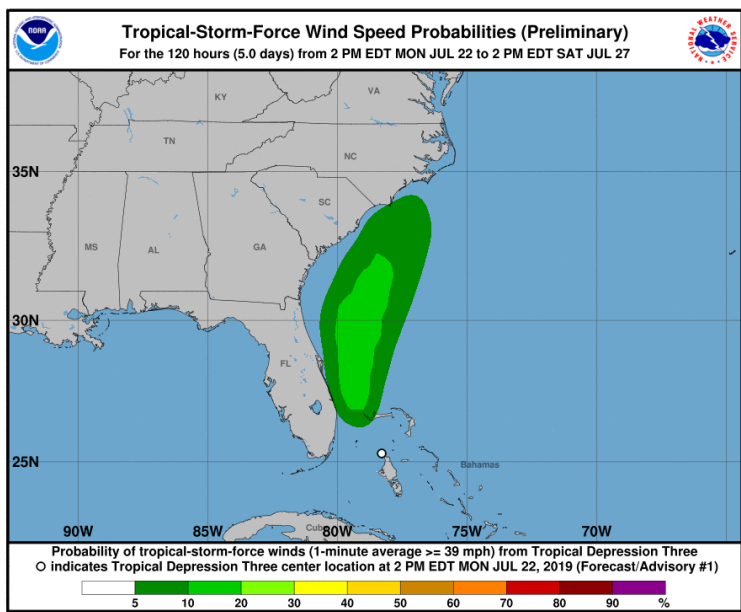
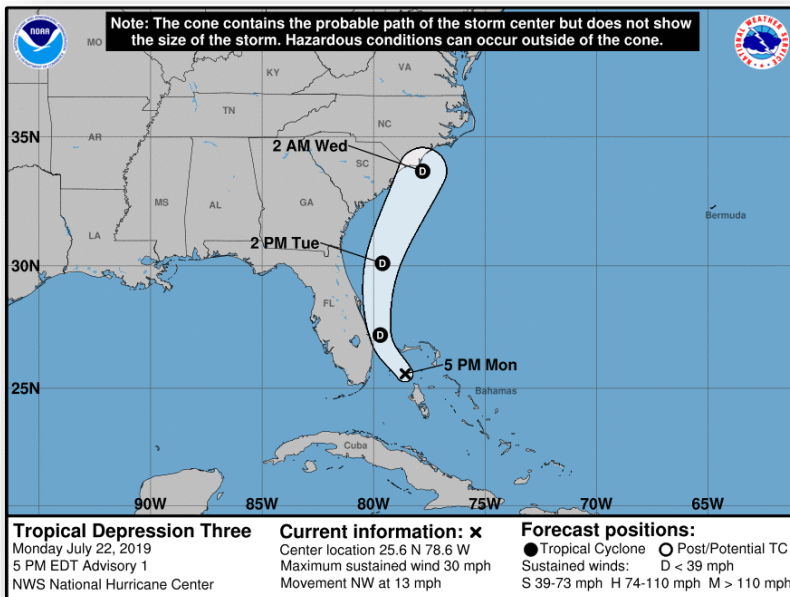

...TD3 has formed in the Bahamas...

Overview: TD#3 located over the Bahamas is expected to move northward and become absorbed by a cold front near the Carolina Coast by Wednesday. A low probability exists that tropical storm force winds will occur, with the best chances remaining off the Southeast U.S. coast.

Impacts: An increasing rip risk and rough surf is likely. In addition, average rainfall amounts of 2-3 inches are expected along with isolated higher amounts, especially along coastal areas. This rainfall could lead to some localized flooding.

Timing: Surf hazards increasing during Tue and continuing Wed. Rainfall increasing Tue, but especially later Tue into Wednesday.
