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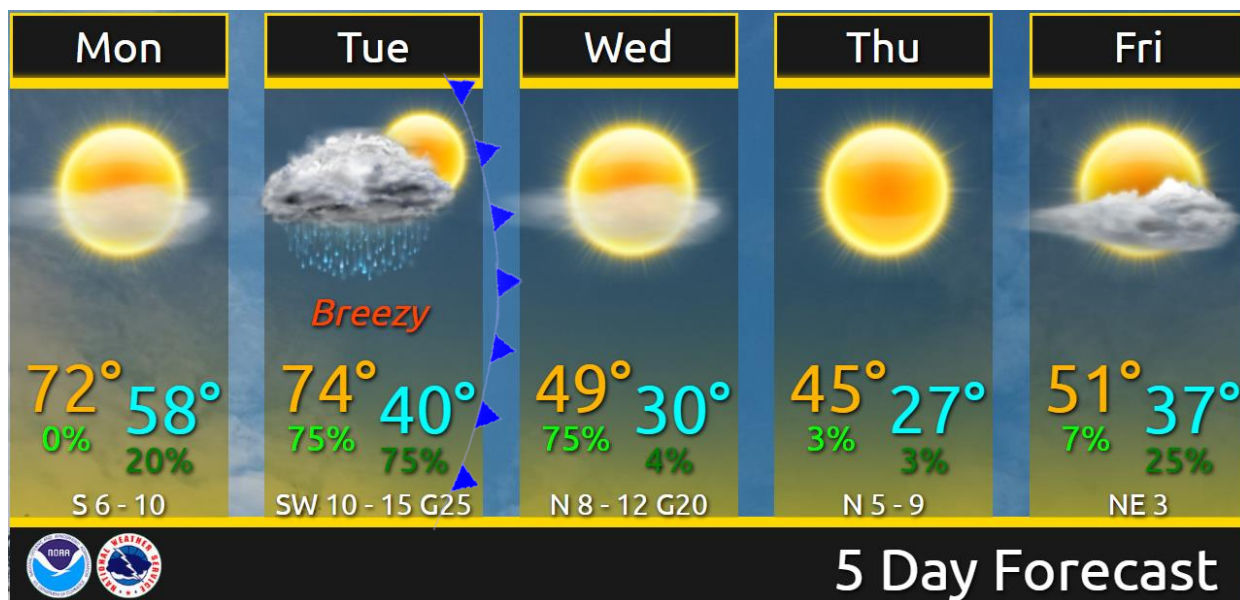
Overview: Warm to start the week with highs in the low 70s. A cold front Tuesday evening will bring rain and a chance of thunderstorms. High pressure builds in behind the front bringing much cooler air Wednesday through the remainder of the week.

Impacts:

- A **chance of isolated thunderstorms** during the cold frontal passage on Tue. afternoon cold produce lightning and gusty winds.
- Rough seas and **Small Craft conditions likely Tue. morning into Wed.**
- Below freezing temperatures during the morning late this week.

Marine: Rough seas possible overnight Mon. into Tue. with SW winds at 15-20 knots and seas 4-6 feet. Winds becoming northerly at 15-20 knots on Wednesday with decreasing seas late in the day. Small Craft conditions likely Tue. morning into Wed.

Rivers: Ongoing river flooding at the Pee Dee River is expected to crest at **Minor** flood stage on Wed. morning; visit [our website](#) for more information.



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
