...Arctic air will remain through Wednesday; warmer with rain by late Friday...

**Overview:** Arctic high pressure to our north will push cold, dry air across the Carolinas today through Wednesday. As the high moves offshore Thursday, temperatures will rebound toward normal. Low pressure approaching from the west should spread rain into the area by late Friday.

**Impacts:** Wind chills will fall into the teens tonight through Tuesday morning, then again Tuesday night. Winds 25 knots and waves 6+ feet across the coastal waters will lead to Small Craft Advisory conditions through at least Wednesday.
