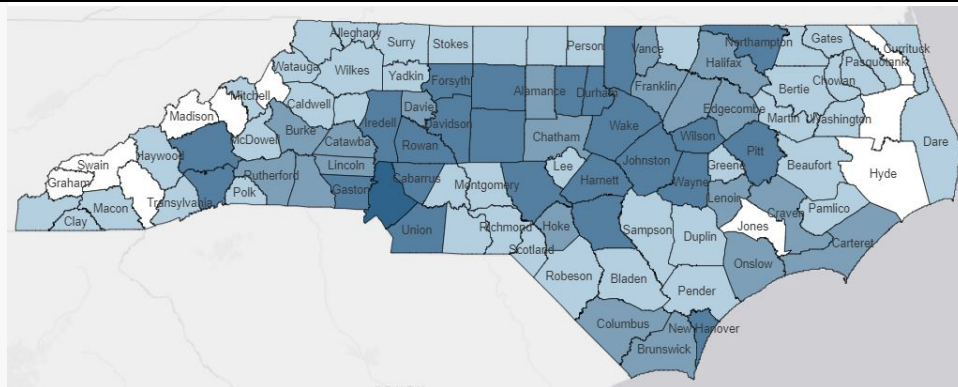
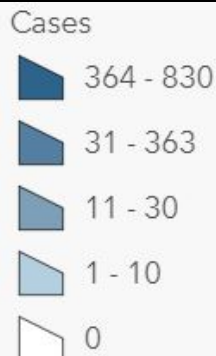




**Pender County Situation Report #28 - COVID-19 Event
April 8, 2020 - The County is operating at EOC Status Level 3.**

<p>7. Current Situation: EOC IS OPERATING AT A LEVEL 3 STATUS. Level 3 is a hazard specific response to an incident. This incident requires the assistance of several State agencies. The Emergency Operations Center is activated but only staffed with essential personnel. The EOC is not operating on 24-hour shifts. The EOC is only functioning during standard business hours, with minimal weekend staffing.</p> <p>Weather: Today: Sunny, with a high near 87. West wind around 9 mph, with gusts as high as 15 mph. Tonight: A slight chance of showers and thunderstorms before 10pm. Partly cloudy, with a low around 64. Southwest wind 3 to 6 mph. Chance of precipitation is 20%. Tomorrow: Mostly sunny, with a high near 88. Southwest wind 6 to 16 mph, with gusts as high as 25 mph. No hazardous weather is expected at this time.</p> <p>Fire Weather: RP-4: High pressure remains centered offshore today. A cold front crosses the area late Thursday, before high pressure returns for Friday and Saturday. Expect low humidity and gusty Northwest winds Friday. Wind profile analysis/fire control over flat terrain is Favorable. Fog potential for tonight is None.</p> <p>GOVERNOR COOPER EXECUTIVE ORDERS (EOs)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> EOs 117, 118, 119, 120, 121, and 122 remain in effect except as superseded by subsequent orders. Details here. EO 124 (March 31, 2020): Prohibited utility shut-offs, late fees, and reconnection fees; provided guidance about restrictions on evictions; encouraged telecommunications providers, banks, and mortgage servicers to provide assistance and flexibility to their customers. EO 125 (April 1, 2020): Authorized and encouraged remote shareholder meetings during the State of Emergency. EO 129 (April 7, 2020): Provided flexibility regarding certain law enforcement training courses. The Governor has indicated additional executive orders to increase availability of healthcare providers, medical supplies, hospital beds, and childcare for essential employees, as well as other issues, will be issued shortly. <p>The public can subscribe to text updates from NC DHHS regarding COVID-19 by texting COVIDNC to 898211. 11. Incident Area: As of **today (4/8)**, the Pender County Health Department is aware of a total of **ninety-five (95)** residents of Pender County who have been tested for COVID-19 by healthcare providers within the county. Of those tests, **two (2)** were confirmed positive, **eighty-four (84)** were confirmed negative, while **nine (9)** tests are currently pending. Additionally, there has been one (1) confirmed positive test of a Pender County resident performed by a healthcare provider outside the county for a **total of three (3) confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Pender County.**

12. External Affairs: Pender County remains in monitoring mode. The Public Information Officer and the communications team are monitoring the County's social media platforms and updating the County's website with accurate information.

13. County Action:

- Pender County School System is feeding students and anyone 18 or younger at an updated list of 56 sites beginning Tuesday, April 7, details [available here](#).
- Pender County Schools is providing wi-fi hotspots for school-issued devices from 7 AM to 7 PM seven days a week at Pender High, Topsail High, Heide Trask High, and West Pender Middle. There is also a public wi-fi access point in the parking lot of the Pender County Public Library in Burgaw.
- Pender County Government is strongly encouraging appointments for in-person visits, information [available here](#). In accordance with the governor's order that teleworking be practiced to the maximum extent possible, many staff members began teleworking starting Tuesday, March 31.
- Pender County Board of Commissioners Chairman George Brown declared a State of Emergency effective Monday, March 30, 2020.

14. Other Notes, Issues or Additional Remarks: Pursuant to EO 117 issued March 14, 2020, all persons are urged to maintain social distancing (approximately six feet away from other people) whenever possible and to continue to wash hands, utilize hand sanitizer and practice proper respiratory etiquette (including coughing into elbow).

CDC recommends wearing cloth face coverings in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain (e.g., grocery stores and pharmacies) **especially** in areas of significant community-based transmission.
